1. Background

- Effectiveness of the Home Based Working policy
- Any changes in employment legislation

3. Wider political environment

- Change of government
- The current geopolitical crisis
- Cyber security risks
- Impact of cost of living increases

4. Healthcare Sector-specific issues

- Integrated Care Systems White Paper and the prospects for integration of complementary and mainstream healthcare
- Social prescribing
- Personal Health Budgets/Self Directed Support
- Standards for the delivery of online training and assessment
- February 2023 published outcome of 2022 government consultation on 'Healthcare regulation: deciding when statutory regulation is appropriate and how powers to introduce and remove professions from regulation might be used in the future'
- 2023 draft legislation on GMC's statutory powers granting them more flexibility and a new fitness to practise model that allows more cases to be decided consensually, outside of a formal hearing. Intended to act as the blueprint for reforms to other statutory health regulators.
- Professional Standards Authority consultation on good practice guidance documents in support of regulatory reform.

5. Potential addition

5.1 On 4 April MC represented CNHC in a round table consultation on the Scottish Government draft legislation to make conversion practices a criminal offence. The term 'conversion practices' is used to refer to acts which are intended to change or suppress a person's sexual orientation or gender identity.
