	There were no matters arising.		
7	Update on Complaints		oral report
	Members noted that		
	 The Conduct and Competence Panel was 		
	scheduled to meet on 31 May to hear a complaint		
	against a Nutritional Therapist but this was		
	cancelled because of the train strike. Before we		
	could arrange a new date the practitioner allowed		
	her registration to lapse. Based on legal advice this		
	means we don't currently have jurisdiction in this		
	matter and can't take any further action at the		
	moment so the complaint lies on file in case the		
	practitioner renews her registration at some future		
	date.		
	Similarly a complaint against a Colon		
	Hydrotherapist that was being investigated remains		
	on file because she allowed her registration to		
	lapse.		
	 There are currently three complaints under 		
	investigation, two against a Massage Therapist		
	(from the same person) and a complaint against a		
	Nutritional Therapist.		
	In discussion Members noted that not all Registrants		
	against whom complaints have been made choose to		
	allow their registration to lapse if that opportunity arises		
	before a conclusion is reached.
